Ethics and Integrity: Some Concrete Actions

The Bureau d'intégrité et d'éthique Laval-Terrebonne (BIELT) issued its 2022 annual report. Here are some of its noteworthy achievements.

- Both the codes of ethics and conduct (elected councillors and their employees, and municipal employees) were updated to comply with legislative changes.
- A revised whistleblowing policy providing better protection of whistle-blowers was tabled.
- Two professional investigators started assessing major work sites.
- A directive about the declaration of conflict of interest was adopted and will be implemented.

Note that the City of Laval shows an increase of 2.6% in requests for security clearances compared to last year. Also, 25 administrative inquiries (64 alerts received) were carried out as well as 30 training sessions on ethics reaching 550 people.

Since 2016, the City of Laval actively participates in the Plan municipal d'emploi of the Union des municipalités du Québec (UMQ) for young people placed under youth welfare authority. Each summer, some fifteen young people acquire a first and positive work experience with the City. Social and professional integration, awareness-raising on the role of a city and successful transition towards independence and workforce are the main objectives of this project.

The human experience gained by these young people and the municipal employees involved is what gives full meaning to the project. All agree that it is a unique, rich, and emotional experience.

In May, the Laval project was showcased during the Assises de l'UMQ, in a video produced in 2022. The program implemented by the City stood out thanks to the addition of a key player that supported young people during their learning experience and acted as an interface between all individuals involved; to the variety of jobs offered; to the welcome and end-of-job events; and to the healthcare and social services network collaboration.

Social Development Positive Results

The initiatives of the Politique régionale de développement social (PRDS) aim at improving the welfare of the population. Since 2019, the PRDS results on different issues (housing, food security, mental health, among others) include many initiatives and actions that make a difference. Here are three of them:

- A project office for seniors in a vulnerable situation was created to meet their needs in a concerted way. Projects selected aim at breaking down their isolation, direct them to appropriate resources, and give them volunteer transportation services to low-price grocery stores.
- A working committee was created to evaluate and respond to the growing needs of Immeubles Val-Martin housing development.
 Also, the hiring of additional social workers will help create relationships with residents and guide them to the most appropriate community organizations.
- A new service pole in mental health, accessible to all citizens, is scheduled to open in Chomedey. This new mental health resource centre will help reduce obstacles faced by Laval anglophone community and all other citizens of the area.

Better Sharing the Streets And An Increased the Sense of Safety

To encourage better road sharing practices and ensure citizens can move safely, the City has announced a series of actions including reducing the speed limits in urban zones.

Also, to curb excessive enthusiasm of certain motorists in a hurry and provide safer intersections, no less than 1,200 traffic calming measures will be implemented by 2026, such as speed bumps, beacons or bollards, curb extensions, etc. Moreover, the City will continue to encourage active mobility by improving road access for all.

In your municipal magazine, look for new measures and initiatives to make the city a more enjoyable and safer place to live.

According to a recent survey, 57% of Laval's citizens living on a street where the speed limit is 40 km/h and up want to see it reduced on their street.

Reducing speed limits

New this spring, speed limit in urban zones was reduced by 10 km/h across a large area of the city. Beware! During the upcoming weeks, those changes will progressively be made.

So, maximum speed limit will be:

- 30 km/h on local streets;
- 40 km/h on collector roads leading to the main streets;
- 50 km/h on main streets.

In industrial, semi-rural and rural zones, present speed limits will generally remain effective.

More speed bumps on the territory

This year, 300 new speed bumps are scheduled to be installed mainly near daycare centres and seniors' residences. Note that in 2021 and 2022, over 700 speed bumps were added near parks with playground equipment and primary school.

This summer, notice that the panels will look like a hairy texture – this is to remind motorists to drive smoothly and ensure comfort for all. Also keep abreast of the ad campaign jingle *Tout doux dans nos rues*

Reinforced safety measures for pedestrians

As of this year, pedestrian signal lights near mobility hubs and Société de transport de Laval (STL) bus stops will be extended (10 sites per year). In 2024, 15 intersections will be equipped with new pedestrian signal lights and 7 others with audible traffic signals.

Also, a new visual marking system, developed by the ministère des Transports et de la Mobilité durable, will be integrated to pedestrian crossings.

Active mobility is for each and everyone

To continue to bring down road accidents, both cyclist and pedestrian networks will be increased by 10 to 15 km annually.

In addition to these investments, equitable road sharing practices will create more room for active mobility. To do so, sidewalks will be widened, and vegetated areas added to not only encourage physical exercise but also contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gases and provide universal accessibility.

Your Police Officers on the Roads This Summer to Improve Safety

With the nice weather back, the number of bike riders, pedestrians, motorcyclists and, of course, motorists, increases on our roads. Unfortunately, summertime often sees an increase in the number of accidents involving motorists and the most vulnerable road users.

All summer long, the Service de police de Laval (SPL) will increase actions to raise awareness about speed, reckless behaviours and distracted driving issues. Compliance with the regulation near traffic lights, the safety of pedestrians and the enforcement of traffic signs will be on the SPL agenda. Note that your police officers will pay special attention to school zones at the end and the beginning of the school year.

As a result of a collision with a ground vehicle, the risk (of death) for pedestrians rises exponentially according to speed.



Safety tips for motorists:

- Always stop your car before the stop line.
- Respect pedestrian crossing priority.
- Use a hand signal to tell pedestrians to cross the street.
- Always put your lights on to be visible.

Safety tips for pedestrians:

- Cross at the nearest intersection or pedestrian crossing.
- Wait for pedestrian traffic signs.
- Always look for traffic on both sides before crossing.
- Be careful when you are near a heavy vehicle.
- Wear bright clothing.
- Watch out when using your cellphone while walking.

A Plan to Face Climate Emergency

In Laval, we already feel the negative effects of climate changes: more frequent floods, intense heat waves, longer power failures, cancellation of winter activities because of warmer weather, etc.

Even if it is already too late, in Laval and elsewhere, to stop global warming, it is still possible to slow its progression and reduce its impact. To do so, the City of Laval adopted last spring its Plan climatique – Horizon 2035. It aims at reducing greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) by 33% and at increasing its resilience towards climate variations.

This first plan was developed with the intention of rallying all territorial actors and taking concrete actions. The plan includes 9 orientations, 60 measures as well as 374 actions to be taken by 2025 thanks to investments totalling \$276 MM, including financial support of \$64.8 MM by the gouvernement du Québec's Plan pour une économie verte 2030.

Some of the key measures:

- \$81 MM to replace fossil fuels by renewable energy alternatives in existing buildings and new municipal buildings.
- \$44 MM to encourage durable mobility on the territory (development of cyclist and pedestrian networks, preferential measures for buses, carsharing project, development of an integrated durable mobility plan).
- \$32 MM to acquire, protect, and connect the natural environments of Laval, all with the aim of safeguarding the ecological functions of ecosystems and enhancing the resilience of green infrastructure.
- \$23 MM to carry out a waterfront project ensuring shoreline stability due to erosion.
- \$9 MM to plant trees and demineralize areas to fight against urban heat islands and to increase canopy cover.
- \$6 MM to electrify the entire municipal fleet.
- \$1.6 MM to improve the response during extreme weather events.

Your Urban Forest Honoured by the SIAQ

This spring, all the work done these past years to protect and improve our forest heritage and natural habitats was praised. During the Arboricultural Merit Award event organized by the Société internationale d'arboriculture Québec Inc. (SIAQ), the City of Laval was awarded the Grand Mérite de la feuille d'or, that is the most prestigious honour!

This award recognizes outstanding projects impacting communities or regions while emphasizing the value of trees and the urban forest.

Since Laval decided to be proactive with its urban forest in 2014, the team dedicated to this project has almost tripled. Let us remind the various tree planting and greening projects that add some 18,690 trees on our streets and parks and 42,000 trees sown and potted.

Farmer Tips for an Ecological Garden

The methods used by Laval farmers are constantly evolving to ensure the growth of quality produces while reducing their impact on the environment. There is increased awareness of the producers on the use of pesticides. They minimize their use and some of them even stopped using them when replacement methods are available.

This summer, be inspired by the best farmers' tips to protect your crop from parasites and insects ... without using pesticides!

1. A good way to keep harmful insects away from your garden is sowing early in the spring to avoid the presence of pests before they lay their eggs, or late in the summer when eggs are hatched.

- When fighting against pests, certain seeds can be very helpful. For instance, onion, chive, and garlic are ideal repellents against some parasites, while parsley, mint, and lemongrass keep aphids away.
- 3. Make sure to regularly weed your garden; if you notice any sign of diseases, simply cut sick leaves and stems to avoid the spread.

The Achoo Weed!

To reduce the amount of pollen in the air and contribute to the general well-being, it is important to identify ragweed and to remove it before August 1st. Remember that in Quebec, ragweed pollen is the main cause of allergies wich affects close to 40,000 Laval residents.

Green Taxation Becomes Real

A green taxation project was initiated by the City of Laval this year. It first aims at encouraging citizens and organizations to adopt more ecoresponsible behaviours. Also, it will generate tax income to finance environmental programs that reduce our ecological footprint.

Therefore, three new by-laws will facilitate Laval ecological transition while redistributing a portion of the environmental costs of certain economic activities. They will namely involve:

- an increase in the pricing of potable water consumption by industries, commercial businesses, and institutions;
- a tax on residential oil-fired heating systems;
- a tax on paved areas in downtown Laval.

First Edition of the Défi Île zéro déchet

After six months, 25 Laval families ended their first zero waste challenge. They were accompanied by the Conseil régional de l'environnement (CRE) de Laval and attended a few workshops (ex.: homemade cleaning products, zero waste Christmas).

Their results were noteworthy: 30% waste reduction, 39% fewer recycled materials and 45% decrease in organic materials. The City congratulates these 25 families for their involvement.



Chlorine: Hazardous Material

Did you know? Chlorine and its container are household hazardous wastes (HHW). It is forbidden to place them in your home collection bins as they are flammable materials. For everyone's safety, bring your HHW to Écocentre!

Sorting Recyclable Materials Is Mandatory!

Recently, a new by-law controls residual material collection in the territory. It provides a framework for sorting, handling, and collecting the waste and aims at diverting more valuable materials from landfills.

It specifically pertains to the timing of placing and removing the wheeled bin at the curbside, its positioning, and the allowed quantities of materials. Additionally, participation in the collection of organic and recyclable materials is mandatory.

This regulation applies to homeowners, multi-dwelling units, as well as industrial, commercial, and institutional (ICI) establishments.

All details of the new regulation can be found on the City website. Note that most residents already participate in the selective collection. As for the past few years, an awareness brigade will be present during major events to explain the benefits of sorting properly and answer questions.

First Responders for the Past Year

It has been a year since Laval firefighters became first responders. Since May 2022, they can respond to life-threatening emergency calls such as cardiopulmonary arrests, anaphylactic shocks, and opioid overdoses. Presently, it takes an average of five minutes for first responders to arrive on the scene, which is approximately half the time it took before.

First positive results

During this year, as first responders, Laval's firefighters:

- were assigned to 1,561 emergency calls;
- participated in 110 emergency medical interventions for which a death was avoided;
- treated 22 respiratory failures due to opioid overdoses;
- administered epinephrine to 76 people having a severe allergic reaction;
- intervene in over 223 respiratory arrests for which they resuscitated or participated in resuscitation of 10 Laval residents, among which 2 were children;
- reassured over 1,000 citizens thanks to their quick response in a challenging situation.

The integration of a first responder service generated many changes in the work of your firefighters. They handled the challenge brilliantly and are very proud of the impact they had on the survival rate during their interventions and, more widely, on the citizens' quality of life.

A Nice Fire, but From a Distance

To enjoy your outdoor fireplace safely, you must use it with a fire screen. Also, it is important that nor the soot or smoke bothers the neighbourhood.

It is mandatory to install the fireplace on a non-combustible surface respecting the following minimum:

- 10 ft away from buildings;
- 10 ft from your property line;
- 5 ft from trees, hedges, or any other flammable material.

To use pyrotechnic items or even have some in your possession while in a park or on the waterfront, you need to get an authorization issued by the Service de sécurité incendie de Laval.

Emergencies: What to Do

Expect the Unexpected

Summertime may bring its own risks with extreme temperatures, heat-waves, storms, and gusty winds. In the event of a major disaster, you could be required to leave your home quickly, or remain at home without electricity, water, nor access to a grocery store for a few days.

Since we can never predict everything, it is important to be prepared. And the first step is to stay informed as soon as possible when a major event happens – and even a minor one – that could jeopardize your safety. In Laval, you can automatically be informed when you subscribe to municipal updates. To do so, just enter your email address at abonnement.laval.ca.

Then, prepare a self-sufficient kit that enables you to leave your home quickly. This kit should include:

- 1. all items you need to satisfy your basic needs for 72 hours or more;
- 2. a bag (always ready to go) including essential items;

News About the Public Art Collection

Restoration of a work of art in Laval-Ouest

In April 2023, the City restored Laval artist Svlvie Fraser's work of art Branché created in 2012.

Located in Parc Laval-Ouest (7189, 21st Avenue), this piece represents a large branch with a mirror-like shine thanks to the thousands of small coloured glass stones that compose it. In tones of green, these glass stones reproduce details of 22 hardwood trees present in the surrounding woodland.

A large oak leaf made of concrete pavement provides a counterweight to the sculpture verticality and makes us believe the wind made it fall on the ground.

Did you know?

The restoration of the City art collection results from the Politique d'intégration des arts à l'architecture et à l'environnement des bâtiments et des sites gouvernementaux et publics du Québec.

In memoriam of Laval Painter **Louise Robert** (1941-2022)

Artist Louise Robert passed away last November. Her gestural painting, in which she frequently used her fingers to spread the paint, also integrated haiku, a short form of poetry. Her art pieces were featured in many venues such as the Canadian Cultural Centre in Paris, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal, and Salle Alfred-Pellan of Maison des arts de Laval that held a great exhibition and dedicated a catalogue to her artwork. The Ville de Laval art collection includes two paintings by Mrs. Robert. Citizens can see them in the municipal council room until the end of this year.

Sylvain Émard Danse's *Rhapsodie* proposes a powerful and exhilarating performance. Finally, Théâtre Bienvenue aux dames' *Maurice* tells an intimate life story, both dark and bright.

For a young audience, 14 shows are scheduled. Whether as a family outing or a field trip, young children will enjoy dancing to the Petites Tounes music and the group's newest show *Faut toujours faire comme les grands*, or rocking with *Le Potager* by Petit Théâtre de Sherbrooke. Others will prefer the charms of sea creatures featured in L'Illusion show *Archipel*, or Le Gros Orteil company's *Octave* and his clowning behaviour.

Many social issues have also been included in the season programming. DynamO Théâtre's Ceux qui n'existent pas deals with the migratory crisis, and Puzzle Théâtre's puppet show Plastique talks about pollution. Théâtre de la Petite Marée's La nuit du caribou laments the disappearance of mammals. The Samsara Théâtre will make vou think outside the box with Tonne de briques, and the Ombres Folles company will feature the forgotten ones of history in Celle qui marche loin. 2023-2024 Season Exhibits

The Art of Slowing Down

Salle Alfred-Pellan 2023-2024 season program slows the pace, holding true to its mission based on the importance of dialogue and openness to others.

This program wants to pay tribute to artists who keep going despite difficulties and cumulate decades of work experience. These creative people paved the way for contemporary art history and inspired many generations of artists who now follow in their tracks. So, Salle Alfred-Pellan presents the work of determined artists who ran the "art marathon" as described by Éric Devlin, the curator of the Marcel Saint-Pierre exhibit that launches the season.

This exhibit marks the death of this Laval painter, author, and professor. It is judiciously coupled with André-Pierre Arnal's exhibit who is one of the founders of *Supports/Surfaces*, an important artistic movement present in Marcel Saint-Pierre art legacy. Moreover, the *Libérez la peinture!* exhibit will inaugurate the 2023 edition of the contemporary painting event *Pictura* presented in the Greater Montreal.

Also, in conjunction with the production of a monography tracing his fifty years of artistic contribution, artist Denis Rousseau adds a link to the chain of intermediates of an exhibit that introduces the work of artists who leave an artistic and personal legacy to the next generation.

Finally, Libby Hague and Julie Picard explore and bring to life paper art. The first artist depicts the strength of the chaos that leads the world, and the second, the power of intimacy.

Before the start of the season, the art piece by Jocelyne Thibault, the recipient of the Prix du CALQ, for the Laval area, will also be showcased. This study on the importance of the encounter is consistent with Salle Alfred-Pellan commitment and accessibility values.

Conference on Archaeological Findings in Pont-Viau

The conference is about the results of an archaeological operation done during the spring of 2022 on the corner of Saint-Hubert Street and Place Juge-Desnoyers. During the 19th century, this location was the centre of Pont-Viau village. The archaeological inventory, done prior to development works in the district, allowed archaeologists to discover a portion of a hotel foundation operating from the mid-19th century to the beginning of the 20th century. Deposits associated with those remains contained a large quantity of different artefacts attesting a hotel occupied the site during that time.

These different artefacts reflect the development of Pont-Viau village and its social and commercial dynamics at the time a bridge linking Montreal to Île Jésus was being built in the middle of the 19th century. More broadly, this heritage testifies the identity-building process of Pont-Viau inhabitants in a location that served as a crossroads of people and traders. Archaeologist Justine Bourguignon-Tétreault will present the archaeological operation and comment on the newest information it brought to light.





The youngest can listen to tales and borrow books in the reading tents on the site, and the whole family may follow the Bibliomobile that offers relaxing reading areas and mobile tale animations. Tale in a swimming suit, next to municipal pools and splash pads, is the perfect break between two swims.

Rivière des Mille Îles: A Conservation Park in the Making

Last March 13, the mayors of Laval, Rosemère, Deux-Montagnes, Boisbriand, Mascouche, Terrebonne, Sainte-Thérèse, Saint-Eustache, Lorraine and Bois-des-Filion committed themselves to preserve an exceptional green space for their citizens and protect their drinking water.

Their objective is to be granted the official status of natural habitat for the 42-kilometre shoreline boarding the Mille Îles River by 2024.

This park will become a diversified patchwork of protected areas, including the Rivière-des-Mille-Îles wildlife sanctuary, which extension project is presently being studied.

Parks Undergoing Facelifts

Here is a summary of what is going on this summer to improve municipal parks and green spaces.

Four new parks: Étienne-Lavoie, Rondeau, Aubert streets and at Le Sorbier community centre, with playground equipment and urban furniture.

Bon-Pasteur and des Coccinelles parks: permanent educational cycle course set up and addition of urban furniture.

Parc Henri-Dunant: complete renovation of the kids' playground with the addition of equipment and refurbishing of the protective surface.

Parc Bernard-Landry: relocation of the exercise area on the corner of 15th Street. New equipment to be install and renaturalization of the old site.

Parc des Lucioles: green space extension and renaturalization of the new space.

Parc Sainte-Béatrice: reconstruction of two tennis courts with acrylic surface, major refurbishing of the soccer field to accommodate high-level activities. New entrance on Péladeau Street, trail setup and lighting. The courts will be accessible at spring 2024.

Bois de la Source: 2-km hiking trail laid out, urban furniture and sections of walkways on pilings (to preserve and rehabilitate wetlands) added. For everyone's safety, it is important to respect prohibited areas.

A Permanent Rink at Parc du Moulin

The installation of a lit up permanent rink will start this summer at Parc du Moulin, near Tilly Street. Works should end next fall. This four-season rink will allow the practice of many sports such as hockey, pickle ball and basketball on its paved surface.

Transforming the Site of the Old Commodore Marina

In 2022, the City bought the old Commodore marina site to give Laval citizens a direct access to Rivière des Prairies. A revitalization project in underway to create an urban riverfront park on this 1.2 hectare of land, thus expanding the Berge des Écores.

Until revitalization is completed in 2025, some operations are carried out to bring the site to life and provide access to all. The old marina building was torn down and the land will be demineralized during the upcoming months.

A temporary setup combining urban furniture and playground equipment will be installed to provide residents, pedestrians, and bike riders with a rest stop. Structures providing shade and plants will also be added to promote relaxation and encourage public appropriation of the site.

Until November, the work of Laval artist Lisa Tognon will be exhibited in the outdoor windows of the former pavilion of the Berge. This exhibition results from a creation residency the artist completed last spring that required the involvement of Pont-Viau residents.

Public consultation phase 2

In 2021, citizens were asked to share their ideas and suggestions to enhance the site. Since then, various studies were carried out to stimulate reflection on the future development.

By creating this network, the City wishes to offer skateboarders of all ages and levels different quality facilities located in dynamic and accessible environments. Doing so, it also promotes the discovery of emerging sports.

Well-thought facilities

These new courts will be built in alreadypaved areas to maintain green spaces. In fact, plantation areas are also planned in order to add trees providing some shade and reducing heat island effect and to improve urban canopy.

Public art by artist Germaine Koh, the recipient of this year's Governor General Award in Visual and Media Arts will also be integrated to the skateparks.

1. Parc Notre-Dame: A unique design

This facility located in Sainte-Rose will be equipped with an impressive mini ramp covered to allow skateboarding in the shade or on rainy days. The diversity of the different modules and the distance between them will allow users to ride safely and perform their tricks. The large number of trees along the course will provide shade during hot summer days.


2. Parc du Sablon: An enhanced pump track




Bibliomobile Community


