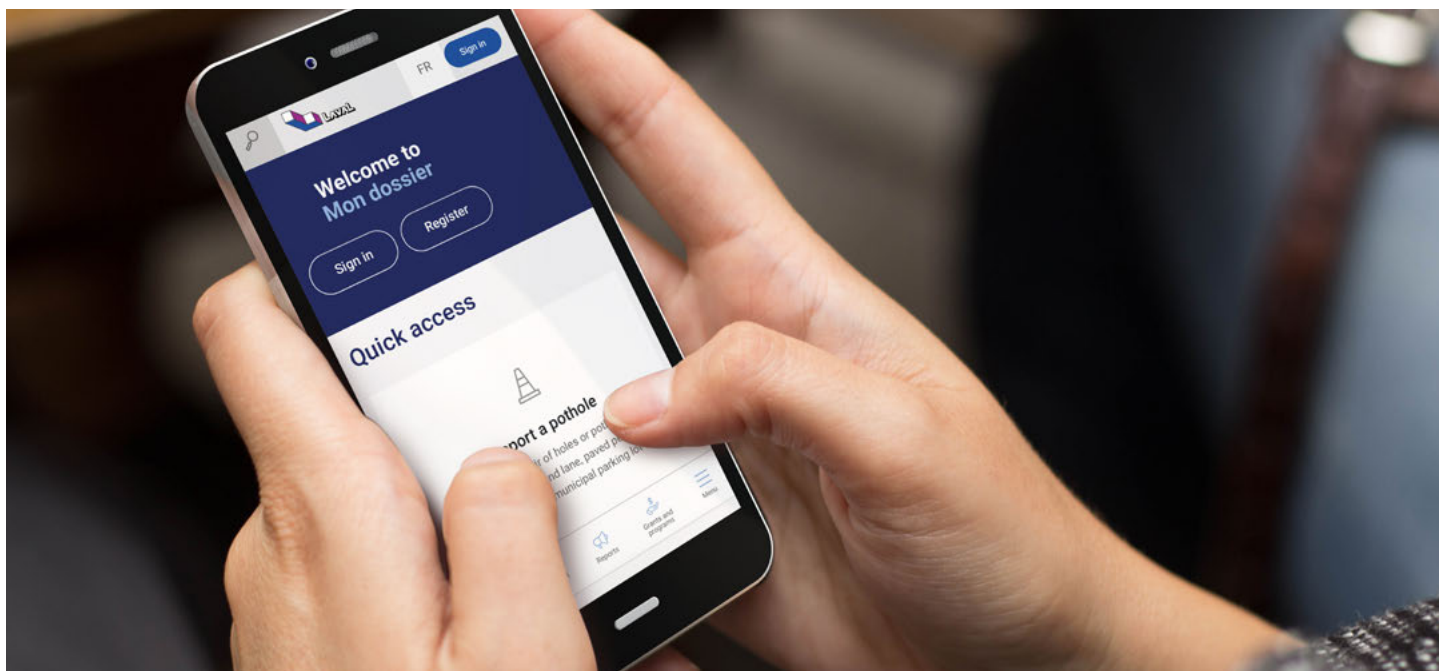

Shorter Queues, More Results

The citizen portal Mon dossier continues to develop. Created internally, it ensures that 85.5% of transactional requests (permits, subsidies, statements, etc.) are now done online. This greater autonomy of citizens reduced the administrative burden and allowed municipal teams to focus on value-added tasks.

Over the last year, significant improvements were noticed on the quality of services provided and citizen experience. In particular, the introduction of standardized deadlines, that is the time between taking care of the request and providing a final answer or solution, has optimized the agents' work organization.

Results are concrete! Service to the community is maintained:

- **faster**, with an average waiting time of 63 seconds for the 311 service during the first half of 2025, an improvement of 87% versus 2021;

- **more efficient**, since 81% of requests were dealt with within set deadlines, a 10-point jump versus 2024, despite an increase of 11% of the total number of requests (60,058 received);
- **more accessible**, since it is possible to make a request and always follow it in Mon dossier, and easily and securely pay online

New features to come

As soon as winter 2026, it will be possible to file permits and urban planning requests for residential work online and pay and get all electronic documents online too.

A new tool to make an appointment will be created by spring 2026 that will allow citizens to plan appointments and virtual meetings with municipal staff for certain requests.

Exploration Dive in the Carré Laval Pond

Under the quiet surface of the Carré Laval pond, an unknown world is to be discovered. Since the end of all quarrying activities, the site slowly filled itself with water, revealing an unsuspected natural potential.

To better understand the composition and evolution of this environment, an exploration dive helped to detail the current state of the pond as well as its underwater characteristics. The diver observed the water quality, the layers of materials which have accumulated over time and any signs of biodiversity. These visual and technical observations are part of the first essential step to evaluate the recreational and ecological potential of the site.

Exploring this underwater world engages a reflection on the future of this pond: a space where nature could come to life again and offer Laval's citizens a unique location for relaxation, learning and discovery in the heart of their city.



A Welcome Centre at the Bois De L'Équerre

A welcome chalet is under construction since September at the main entrance of the Bois de L'Équerre in Sainte-Rose. With its 822 square metres, this new sustainable building is beautifully integrated to the landscape and will be managed by the CANOPÉE organization. It will include a reception area, a multifunctional venue and community spaces. This large project will highlight one of the greatest natural gems of Laval and provide all site users with a place for discovery, education and relaxation.

The site remains accessible via the entrance located at 4204 Industriel Boulevard during the work that should end by October 2026.





Your Bus Network During Winter

Hop on the Bus to Support the Rocket

Once again this season, the STL offers free shuttles between the parking lot of 1333 Chomedey Boulevard and Place Bell when there is a hockey game.

Bus rides are also free from two hours before the game until two hours after, for all hockey ticket holders when they show their ticket upon boarding the bus.

Holidays schedules

Laval citizens aged 65 and over holding a pass can travel freely on the entire STL network. Horizon 65+ is exclusive to the STL, valid at all times. It must primarily be charged with an OPUS card with a picture.

Enhanced Safety

In 2025, efforts continued over the year to make streets safer and encourage active transportation. The road safety squad and the police department prevention squad scaled up their coercive and preventive interventions, paying special consideration to pedestrians, cyclists and electric scooter users.

From January to October, there was a 10% decrease in the number of accidents and a 1% decrease in collisions causing bodily harm, compared to the same period in 2024. As of October 1, 2025, only one fatal accident happened, compared to last three years. A decrease in fatal accidents had also been observed in 2024 versus 2023.

Hundreds of actions were taken in 2025, such as:

- Installation of over 300 speed bumps;
- Addition of 9 raised intersections;
- Installation of pedestrian signals at fifty intersections;
- A hundred rectangular rapid flashing beacons at pedestrian crossings;
- Installation of panels prohibiting to turn right on a red light at more than 10 intersections;
- Better road signage and ground marking near many schools.

Well-Lit Evenings

Since 2021, close to 33,000 lights were converted to LED in the city entire street-light system. During the first phase (2023) over 26,000 Cobra Head lights were replaced. The ongoing second phase will end in December with the replacement of 6,500 decorative lights. This transition to LED provides a greater visibility, more security, a power consumption reduced by up to 75%, lower maintenance costs, a protection of the starry sky and an intelligent management of the network (i.e. more efficiency detection of failures or breakdowns).

Safe Wintertime Travels

Winter calls for alertness and caution on the roads for car drivers, pedestrians and cyclists. Here is some advice to follow:

- Put winter tires on your vehicle and regularly check their condition;
- Keep an emergency kit in your car (blanket, flashlight, boosting cables, first-aid kit);
- Slow down, increase distance between cars and anticipate other people's operations;
- Remove snow and defog all windshields;
- Allow more time for your travels;
- Stay visible when walking or biking by wearing reflecting clothes;
- Use public transport whenever possible, especially during storms and under poor visibility conditions.

Parking: Track Info in Real Time

Complying with road signage contributes to safer streets and helps snow removal. Register to Info-Stationnement to get alerts by email or text message and to know in real time about parking restrictions and snow removing operations.

A vehicle wrongly parked or an obstacle on the street slows the maintenance teams' work and get in the way of emergency vehicles.

Intelligent Parking

A new dynamic parking system is now in effect in Chomedey, Laval-des-Rapides and Pont-Viau to ease car drivers' lives and road maintenance. It improves the efficiency of maintenance operations since cars are removed faster from street parking spots.

Light panels indicate in real time if parking is allowed or not. When they are lit up, a maintenance operation (snow removal, cleaning) is soon to be carried out. Individuals have a few hours to move their vehicle to avoid a parking ticket or towing fees.

Before parking, always check the panels and other restrictions such as those relating to crossroads or specific targeted zones.

As a rule:

Display panel off = parking allowed

Display panel on = move your car before the indicated time deadline.

Fire Prevention: Actions That Make a Difference

During winter, we spend more time at home: make sure you stay safe!

Indoors

- Do not overload electrical outlets and use approved chargers only for your lithium-ion-battery appliances. Cables may overheat and cause electrocution or a fire.
- Fondue dinner? Let the liquid burner cool off before refilling it or use a second one to avoid leaks.
- Keep enough clearance around your heating appliances and avoid drying clothes on them.
- Clear corridors, stairs and exits to ensure a fast evacuation.
- If you use wood to heat your house, have your chimney swept and stock ashes in a tight metal container outside, away from the building. Ashes can remain hot and flammable up to 7 days.

Outdoors

- Remove snow from exits (doors and windows) and from the roof.
- Always keep hydrants accessible. Do not bury them under the snow.
- Make sure your street address is visible to facilitate firefighters' operations if needed.

In case of power outage

- Have an additional heater or a generator but use them with caution.
- Leave any gas appliances and propane tank outside.
- Install a carbon monoxide detector.
- Use approved appliance only.
- Never use a barbecue indoor.

Away From Your Home: Keep It Safe!

You are going away on vacation during the holidays or for a longer time during winter? Take certain precautions to protect your house:

- Ask a neighbour or a family member to check your house and pick up your mail;
- Have snow removed from your entrance and sidewalks regularly to comply with municipal regulation and so it looks like the house is not empty;
- Install timers on your indoor and outdoor lights to simulate your presence;
- Check your alarm system and make sure your emergency contact list is up to date;
- Close all doors and windows tightly and keep valuable out of sight;
- Avoid writing about your absence on social media.



The Family Safety Plan: A Good Resolution

The end of the year is the ideal time to set useful resolutions. This year, give yourself peace of mind and take the time to develop your family safety plan. It is important to do so since ensuring your own safety is your responsibility.

What is a family safety plan?

It is a document that contains all essential information to be ready to respond to emergencies and to protect yourself and your family.

What should it include?

- The main risks known in your district.
- Contact details of the person to join in case of an emergency.
- The location of essential equipment in your house (main water valve, electrical panel, floor drain, gas valve, etc.).
- A fire evacuation plan.
- Information to rapidly evacuate or to be independent for the first 72 hours after a disaster.

An Emergency? Receive Alerts Quickly!

Emergencies are more frequent and unforeseeable than ever.

In case of an accident involving hazardous materials, an emergency evacuation, a flood risk or a problem with drinking water, for instance, the City authorities must be able to reach you quickly.



Register online to the City automated system to receive alert messages by phone or text messaging or by email in case of an emergency or a situation requiring your immediate attention.

Stray Cats: A Pilot Project

Since last fall, a Trap-Neuter-Release-Maintain pilot project for stray cats is being developed in some districts. This program, carried out by the City with the SPCA Lanaudière Basses-Laurentides, aims at reducing the stray cat population but also at promoting the well-being and the coexistence of citizens and these animals.

To avoid any confusion, everyone must comply with the municipal by-law. All domestic cats must be neutered, microchipped, registered and wear a tag.

A holiday season without excess nor waste? Yes, it is possible! Simple actions can make a real difference.



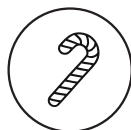
Gifts That Make Sense

After the celebrations, put your natural tree to be collected by the City so it can be composted. Note that an artificial tree is used at least 20 years to be as sustainable as a natural tree.



Sustainable Decorations

Take care of your decorations and use them year after year. If some are broken, repair them to give them a second life.

A Street That Collects Rainwater

Over the past few months, a water-permeable paving is being tested on Leclair Street. It is a first in Canada: the paving is specially designed for this short street open to car traffic. Rainwater directly infiltrates the ground, preventing runoff from entering sewer drains. This concrete solution aims at facing heavy rainfalls, preventing urban flooding and alleviates demand on sewer networks.

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) finances this pilot project, and the Institut national de la recherche scientifique (INRS) cooperates as a partner. The analyses to be done during the coming years will help improve the methods used to create resilient and sustainable streets, adapted to the specific ground characteristics and to local realities.

Isabella, Laval citizen, proud sorter of residual waste

Tips By Isabella, A Proud Sorter

Here is Isabella, who has been taking part in the organic waste collection since her teenage years. Isabella significantly reduces her garbage bag content by efficiently sorting residual waste. She puts each type of waste in the right bin.

According to RECYC-QUÉBEC figures, 78% of residual waste should be put in the brown bin (organic materials) or the blue bin (recyclable materials).

Adopting good composting habits reduces our collective greenhouse gas footprint and enhance the soil and microbial life thanks to nutrients that are essential to good compost.

Isabella's Tips

Organic Materials

- Take part in the collection (brown bin) or use your own compost bin.
- Reduce food waste as much as possible.

Waste Reduction at Source

- Buy in bulk of family size.
- Avoid single-use products as well as unnecessary bags and containers.

Salvage

- Remember that containers, wraps and printed matters only are to be put in the blue bin.
- Lightly clean containers before throwing them.
- Visit the eco-centre so a maximum of materials can be salvaged, recycled and recovered.

Biweekly Collection of Brown Bin During Winter

Starting December 1st, the organic waste collection goes back to its winter schedule every other week. To avoid your leftovers and kitchen waste from freezing and remaining at the bottom of the bin, wrap them in a newspaper or a paper bag before throwing them in. A simple way to keep your bin clean all winter long.

Assistance for Replacing Oil Heating

The installation of new oil heating systems has been prohibited in Québec since 2021. Also, replacing them with a heating appliance that uses fossil fuel is no longer allowed since 2023.


If you replaced your oil heating system between September 4, 2017, and December 31, 2025, you could get a subsidy up to \$2000.



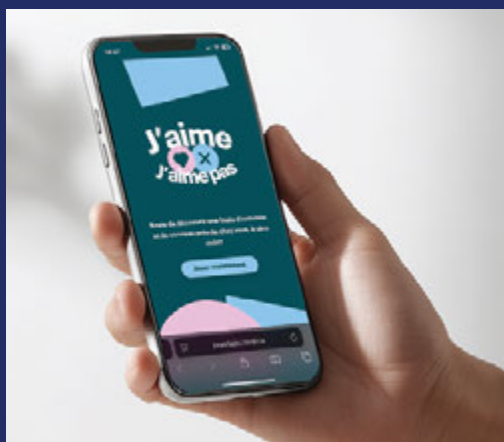

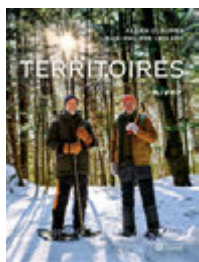
When done, the building will be an example of contemporary, sustainable architecture that opens to its urban surroundings.

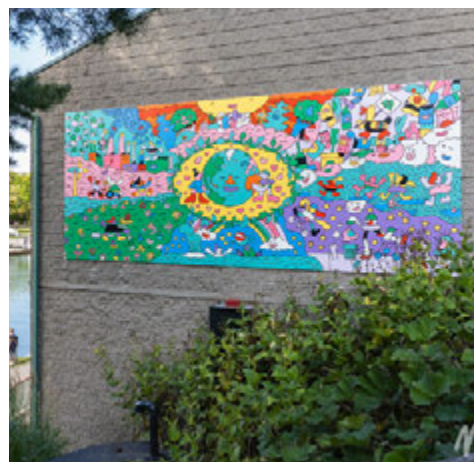

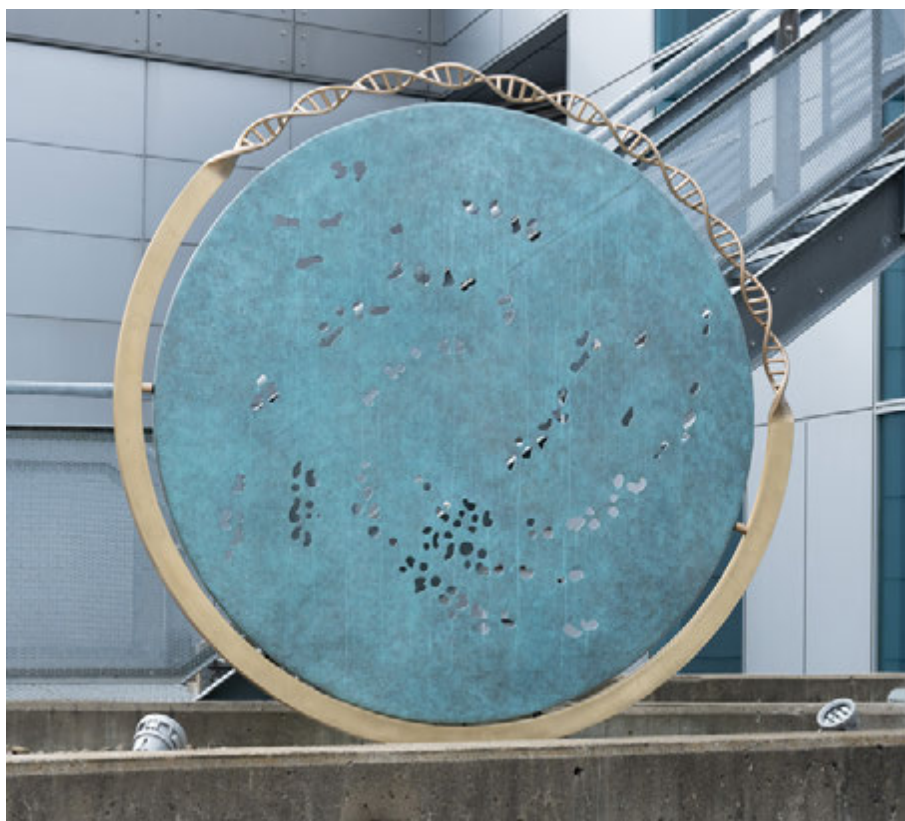
Public Art Invades the City

Addition of 22 New Art Pieces

The City of Laval Art Collection has grown with 22 new pieces. They can be seen online or admired in some municipal buildings.

Among the new additions, a strange painting by David Gagnon represents a headstone, bearing a necklace but no inscription, around which arrows seem to be floating out of a computer monitor.

Pastel-coloured painting by Muriel Ahmarani Jaouchmet represents mythical birds echoing those of ancient Egypt. The art piece tells the story of the artist Armenian family migration from Egypt to Canada.

Karen Tam's artwork tells a personal story with its bird cutouts (predator and prey) that reminds us of traditional Chinese paintings.

Finally, photographer Pilar Macias wrapped herself in spruce branches under the warm sun of the day to subtly impersonate winter.

Maison Forget

Two Laval Heritage Gems Protected

Two high-historical value buildings are now protected as a heritage resource which is the highest status a City can give a heritage building. These unique built heritage elements of Laval history will remain protected for future generations.

The meticulously restored Maison Forget, built around 1715, is an important witness of the ancient architecture on the island. The Maison Goyer, built around 1860, and its cellar have a unique style and are remarkably preserved.

Résidence de création Marcel-Saint-Pierre

The house located at 765 Des Patriotes Street where late painter Marcel Saint-Pierre lived for 45 years maintains its artistic and cultural mission. As early as fall 2026, a residency program will welcome professional artists from Laval, Québec, Canada and abroad to create in this inspiring location. The Laval community will also be invited to discover the house. Stay tuned for more details in 2026.

A Protected Heritage


The house located on the Mille-Îles river waterfront was built near 1729 and extended around 1770. Classified as one of the oldest heritage houses in île Jésus, it underwent major restoration work by the City of Laval and the financial support of the gouvernement du Québec.

The work that ended last summer on schedule and on budget gave a second life to several original features such as stonework, woodwork, windows and chimney. Thanks to a meticulous restoration, this heritage house gained back its authenticity and unique character.

Children and adults may borrow for free different winter sports equipment such as snowshoes, walking sticks, ice traction cleats, oversized tire bikes (fat bikes), sleds, adapted sleds for mobility-impaired persons, etc.

Winning Conditions to Open Outdoor Skating Rinks

The opening of skating rinks depends on the weather. Everything is put in place to make them accessible as early as December, but some essential conditions must be met to do so.

Work may start when the weather remains at -5 °C for at least seven days in a row and if the snow cover is at least fifteen centimetres thick.

The time necessary to prepare the ice takes a few days and the weather must be cold enough. During crack sealing operations with snow and regular watering (from two to three times a day for approximately five days), skating rinks will not be available.

Indoor Skating

During the holidays, all municipal arenas will be opened, and a special programming will be offered to the whole family. To enjoy activities and ensure a fun experience to all, registration will be required during this period.

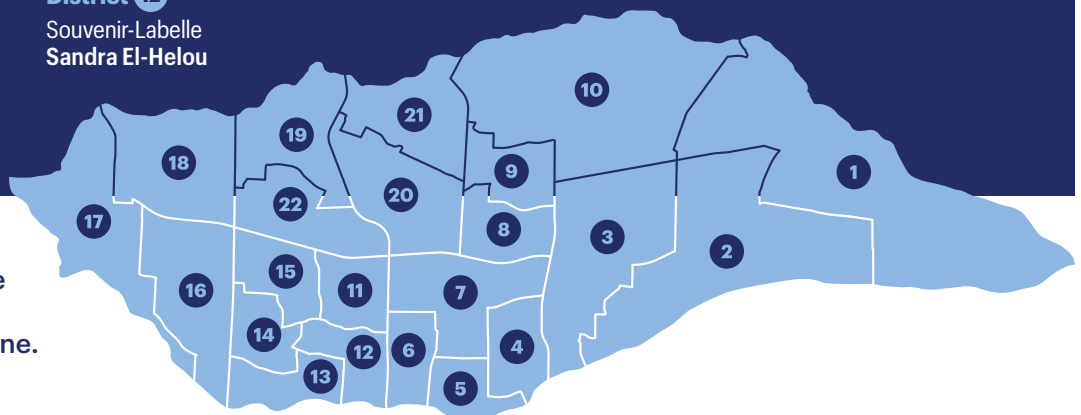
